

**Quarterly Public Reporting Requirement for HEERF Student Aid Portion
Hawaii Medical College

- 1. - 2. The total amount of funds that the institution will receive or has received from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs.**

Hawaii Medical College has been awarded \$479,124 for HEERF II and \$282,209 for HEERF III.

- 3. The total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed to students under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs as of the date of submission (i.e., as of the initial report and every calendar quarter thereafter).**

As of March 31, 2022, Hawaii Medical College has distributed \$65,124 to students from HEERF II. Additional funds are being distributed in 2022.

- 4. The estimated total number of students at the institution that are eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs.**

It is estimated that approximately 230 Hawaii Medical College students are eligible to receive these funds.

For the quarter ending March 31, 2022, 161 students received funds from HEERF III

Hawaii Medical College has provided \$900 per student from remaining portion of HEERF II and HEERF III.
